Just shared in light of your meeting this afternoon.

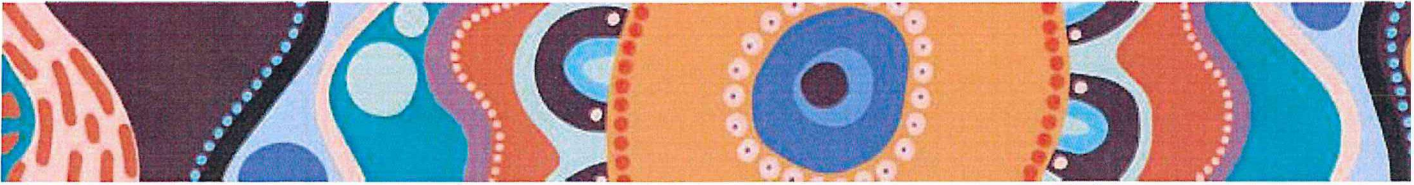

Thank you very much for meeting with us today in your busy Canberra schedule of meetings.

We appreciated hearing your insights into what you are seeing in school communities especially the trends to do with cost of living challenges particularly with homelessness and food security; nutrition bullying; school attendance and the seminars being run on vaping, consent and online pornography. Certainly many important issues at play at the time same.

We undertook to discuss the emerging food crisis issue at the next National Wellbeing Forum led by the Tasmanian Education Department which meets quarterly. If you have any insights on whether the breakfast clubs lead to an increase in attendance we would value hearing your on the ground findings.
